Fresh new foliage and blooms are in the air as the Village is anxious to begin it's 2023 Spring projects!

We are honored and very excited to have been awarded the 2023 OSLAD GRANT for \$600,000.

Governor JB Pritzker announced nearly \$60 million in state grants are being awarded for 118 local park projects throughout Illinois. According to the governor's office, \$2.39 million of that will be invested in local parks including \$600 thousand for the Village of Monee. This gives us a much needed financial boost to help with the costs of the Firemen's Park Master Plan Project.

Water main replacement, construction on the new pavilion, road resurfacing, Court Street bridge patching and decorative lighting are also on the agenda.

Homelessness, drug and alcohol abuse, mental health issues and domestic violence. Monee is not immune to these types of issues. We probably deal with most of them weekly, some of them daily. It affects a small percentage of our overall population, but takes up a large percentage of our time and resources. It is a Monee problem, which is only a microcosm of a national problem. When your

neighborhood is quiet and you don't see people sleeping under the bridge, it is easy to assume that our biggest worry is that someone might steal our catalytic converter. I wish that was the case. Don't think that we are exaggerating or trying to make things sound worse than they really are. We aren't telling you something that you don't already know. We are telling you that these are serious issues and when you suspect domestic violence, drug use or even child abuse, you should feel obligated as a safe community member to call us. We have the people and the training to interdict many of these issues before they are too far out of control and evolve into someone being seriously hurt or worse. We often partner up with Monee Fire when responding to these types of calls and are grateful for their excellent training and our working relationship. We are also very fortunate to live in an area that has numerous options available for us to get people

the assistance they need, whether its mental health, domestic safety or food and shelter. Will County and the South Suburban co-ops offer a wide array of assistance programs from food pantries, utility bill help, disability assist, senior assist, job training and employment options to name a few. They also provide shelter, food and treatment options. There are many parts of this country that do not have these resources easily available for them. We are even more fortunate than our neighbors with the Monee Alliance of Churches always looking to help those in need and our own Mayor and Board of Trustees setting aside an emergency assistance fund for those who find themselves with emergency needs. Many of our local businesses are always willing to help out in times of necessity and often volunteer their time and money to a worthy cause. Consider yourselves very lucky to have neighbors like these.

This letter wasn't intended to be doom and gloom. It is factual. Any family, any community member, any child can be affected by the maladies we deal with daily. The intention is to show those of us not affected directly by crisis of one type or another, are very fortunate. And Monee is fortunate to have people who are willing to serve and assist at a moment's notice. We can never fix all the world's problems, but it's nice to know that this community has your back!! Hydrant Flushing —

Spring is here once again, and with it comes our annual spring water main flushing. Our process will be much the same as it has been in recent years, flushing water mains throughout the Village, and should take about 3-4 weeks to complete. One thing that will be different, however, is that we may schedule additional flushes as needed throughout the summer months. These additional flushes will likely be isolated to specific areas, and will not be system-wide. This is being done as part of an ongoing effort to improve water quality. While we take a great deal of pride in the quality of the water we deliver to our residents, we will never take anything for granted and will always strive to provide the best possible water quality.

As we all know, flushing water mains can be an inconvenience for residents, but it is an essential maintenance procedure, the benefits of which are twofold. First, sediment resulting from natural mineral content can cause degraded water quality, and flushing is the most economical method by which to remove that sediment. Secondly, flushing water mains serves as a “stress test” for our distribution system, allowing us to identify and repair problems that arise from increased flows.

As we move forward, a few important things to remember are:

- Water mains will be flushed beginning the week of April 11, 2023. Operations will commence at 7am daily, and will normally end at 3pm. Flushing may, however, continue to as late as 7pm as circumstances warrant.
- Water main flushing will continue every weekday until we have flushed our entire distribution system. We estimate that the entire process will take 3-4 weeks to complete.
- We will begin flushing at the nearest point to our water source, which is our 50,000 gallon elevated water tank on South Chestnut Road. From there we will fan out to the east, south, and north all the way to the far reaches of our system. At that point, we will return to the tank on Chestnut, fan out to the west, and repeat the process.
- Depending on a number of factors, a water main may take a matter of minutes to run clear, and sometimes can be a matter of hours. Mains are flushed continuously until the water runs clear; therefore, it is difficult to establish an accurate timeline not only for completion, but also for informing residents of exactly when their area will be flushed. Please keep in mind that the attached schedule is an estimate, and exact dates and times are subject to change as conditions warrant.
- **PLEASE WATCH FOR SIGNS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD.** Areas scheduled for flushing will have signs posted at least 24 hours in advance to inform residents.
- During and after flushing, if you encounter discolored water, please open a cold-water tap and let the water run for 5 minutes. If the water does not run clear after 5 minutes, shut the water off, wait 30-45 minutes and repeat. Do not run water constantly for hours, as this is wasteful and ineffective.
- If possible, avoid running hot water taps while the water is discolored. This will help keep sediment from settling in your water heater.
- To avoid staining, do not wash clothes when flushing is occurring in your area, or any time water is discolored.

Yard Waste & Branch Pickups —

Republic Services Yard Waste Pickup

Yard waste can be placed on in either brown paper bags or in your own containers. The containers must be marked with yard waste only stickers. These stickers can be obtained at no-charge by calling customer service at 708-385-8252 or at the Village Hall.



The containers cannot exceed 35 gallons in size, or 40 pounds in weight. **Please Note:** Tree branches in excess of two inches in diameter will not be removed. Tree branches must be bundled in a maximum 2 feet in diameter and 4 feet in length and should weigh no more than 40 pounds. Yard waste in plastic bags is not acceptable.

Branch Pick Up

WE HAVE CHANGED OUR PROCEDURE THIS YEAR.
We will be doing branch pick up TWICE A MONTH: The FIRST MONDAY and the THIRD MONDAY of the month unless a Holiday or Village event going on.

Please have your branches curb side ready for pick up prior to the dates posted below.

All dates are weather permitted. Please note: We do not chip root balls or dirt. Please have these items disposed of properly. We also will not chip trees that have been contracted out for removal.

The Public Works Department understands severe weather events can take place that warrant clean ups.

Only Rain Down the Drain —

Understanding where storm sewer pollution comes from and what you can do to help our community have a better environment.

When the rain or water hits hard surfaces, like pavement, it creates storm water run-off.

The runoff picks up lots of nasty pollution as it is carried directly through the gutters and drains out to the rivers, streams, and lakes making them toxic and unsafe for people and animals. The pollution is typically not treated or removed from the water on its journey, so it's up to us to keep it clean and fresh from the start. Here are some things we can all do to minimize storm water pollution and keep our community looking and feeling great.



Step 1: Maintain your car or truck. Never dump any chemicals from these vehicles down a storm drain. Always recycle used oil, antifreeze and other fluids. Fixing leaks on your vehicle will minimize run-off during rain or watering events.

Step 2: Wash your vehicle at a commercial car wash rather than in the street or in your driveway. These types of facilities typically will contain storm or sanitary basins designed to minimize chemical run-off. If you prefer to wash at home, do so in a grassy area so soaps and cleaners can collect locally on site and not down a storm drain.

Step 3: Drive less. Leave your car at home at least one day each week and take a bus, carpool or bike to work. Combine errands when you drive. Get your vehicle emissions system checked. Buy a low emissions vehicle to reduce pollutants.

Step 4: Cut down on fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. If you use these chemicals, follow the label directions and use them sparingly. Don't fertilize before a rainstorm. Consider using an organic type fertilizer. Compost or mulch lawn clippings. Preserve existing trees or plant new ones—trees hold rainfall and help manage storm water.

Step 5: Pick up after your pets. Scoop your dog's poop and properly dispose of it.

Step 6: Reduce impervious surfaces at home and increase the vegetated land cover on your property. Reduce your rooftop runoff by directing your gutter downspouts to vegetated areas and not directly into the storm drain on your street. For your driveway and patios, consider putting in a permeable paving brick or patterns of cement and brick that allow rain water to filter through it.

If each of us can make some small adjustments in our daily routines now, then together we can insure our water and environment stay clean and healthy for generations to come.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

While we cannot control the occurrence of natural fires, it is crucial to take preventative measures to reduce the risk of fires starting in our homes, businesses, and public spaces.

Cook Safely: Cooking is a leading cause of home fires. To prevent fires, never leave cooking food unattended, keep flammable materials such as dish towels and curtains away from the stove, and clean grease buildup regularly.



Have a Fire Escape Plan: Having a fire escape plan is critical in case of a fire. Make sure everyone in your home knows what to do in case of a fire, including where to go and how to evacuate the building safely.

BUILDING SERVICES & CODE COMPLIANCE

Being compliant with Village ordinances keeps Monee looking good!

Placement Of Containers For Collection; Time Period:

It shall be the duty of any person having household garbage or rubbish to comply with all provisions of this chapter, and on each day of garbage, rubbish or recycling collection to place the containers as aforesaid on the curb in front of the residential premises receiving said disposal services no earlier than 12:00 Noon on the day before collection and should be removed by 7:00 P.M. the day of collection. All garbage, rubbish, or recycling containers shall not be stored in the front yards on non-trash days. All garbage, rubbish, or recycling containers shall be stored behind a privacy fence or out of view from public areas. If you have more than one large item that will not fit into the trash bin, please make arrangements with Republic Services at 708-385-8252 based on the size and number of those additional items.



All inoperable motor vehicles whether on private or public property and in view of the general public are to be considered a nuisance. Inoperable vehicles means any motor vehicle for



which a period of at least seven days, the engine, wheels or other parts have been removed or on which the engine, wheels or other parts have been altered or so treated that the vehicle is incapable of being driven under its own motor power.

To park, store, keep any vehicle in any rear, side or front setbacks on private or public property on grass or gravel is prohibited.



All grass used for landscaping purposes or grown wild on vacant property shall not exceed six (6") inches in height at any time.

Licenses for Contractors —

Any permitted work within the limits of the Village require both Contractors and Subcontractors to be licensed with the Village. All licenses are from January 1 thru December 31. For a list of contractors who have already registered with us, please see our website!



Selling your home? —

The Village of Monee requires any properties within the village to have a pre-sale inspection performed prior to closing, fee is \$50.00. You are also required to schedule a final water read to close your account.



Renting your home? —

Prior to engaging in the business of renting any rental unit to the public, every owner of a rental property, whether occupied or vacant, shall file with the Village a completed license application including the appropriate fee for each rental unit.




Certificate of Occupancy: A Certificate of Occupancy includes an inspection of the unit and shall be required upon any of the following events:


