have had witnesses to crowd disturbances tell us that the incident has been in the making for the last three days. A lot of people hear a lot of stories that should give us all cause for concern. It could be two groups fighting in the park, a planned flash mob or a student bringing a weapon to school. There is always someone out there who knows or hears about something that is going to happen, but doesn't let local law enforcement in on the plan. While we have a lot of sources of intelligence throughout our communities, we don't have the ability to catch everything before it happens. Not without your assistance. Hindsight is 20/20. It can also be the difference between police action or someone getting seriously hurt.

Finally, always take care of yourself and your family. Take notice of your surroundings. Always have a safety plan for you and your family. How to do and what to do in any emergency or dangerous situation. Don't put yourself in situations or environments that don't have a safe outlet. If you do find yourself in a precarious position, put your phone in your hand and have it ready to dial 911 with a one button touch, or call someone and tell them what's going on. If the situation turns, make sure they know to contact help. You can't always control your environment, but you can stay aware of what is happening around you. Easy targets are those who are not paying attention and/or those who look overwhelmed or fearful. Appear confident. Not confrontational.

Remember to lock your car doors every day! For home security, utilize lighting and motion lighting for the perimeter. Secure garage doors and windows. If you like your screen windows open, wedge the slider so it will only open so far. And, as always, if it don't feel right, it probably aint right...Call us Its what we do... We all deserve to have a great summer, so Stay safe, Stay smart and Stay cool!!

Hydrant Flushing —

Our process will be much the same as it has been in recent years, flushing water mains throughout the Village, and should take about 3-4 weeks to complete. One thing that will be different, however, is that we may schedule additional flushes as needed. These additional flushes will likely be isolated to specific areas, and will not be system-wide. This is being done as part of an ongoing effort to improve water quality. While we take a great deal of pride in the quality of the water we deliver to our residents, we will never take anything for granted and will always strive to provide the best possible water quality.

As we all know, flushing water mains can be an inconvenience for residents, but it is an essential maintenance procedure, the benefits of which are twofold. First, sediment resulting from natural mineral content can cause degraded water quality, and flushing is the most economical method by which to remove that sediment. Secondly, flushing water mains serves as a “stress test” for our distribution system, allowing us to identify and repair problems that arise from increased flows.

As we move forward, a few important things to remember are:

- Operations will commence at 7am daily, and will normally end at 3pm. Flushing may, however, continue to as late as 7pm as circumstances warrant. Water main flushing will continue every weekday until we have flushed our entire distribution system. We estimate that the entire process will take 3-4 weeks to complete.

- **PLEASE WATCH FOR SIGNS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD.** Areas scheduled for flushing will have signs posted at least 24 hours in advance to inform residents.
- During and after flushing, if you encounter discolored water, please open a cold water tap and let the water run for 5 minutes. If the water does not run clear after 5 minutes, shut the water off, wait 30-45 minutes and repeat. Do not run water constantly for hours, as this is wasteful and ineffective. If possible, avoid running hot water taps while the water is discolored. This will help keep sediment from settling in your water heater.

- To avoid staining, do not wash clothes when flushing is occurring in your area, or any time water is discolored.

Snow and Your Mailbox —

Regrettably, in extreme winter conditions, mailboxes can be damaged during snow removal because they are installed close to the road in the highway right-of-way as a courtesy to the US Postal Service. In most cases, damage to mailboxes is a result of the force of snow coming off a plow's blade. This scenario is dependent on weather conditions, amount of snowfall, and the weight of snow. At times, the Village or private contractor's plow will accidentally hit and damage a mailbox. This is an unfortunate consequence of snow removal with heavy equipment in challenging weather conditions.

How can you determine how your mailbox was damaged? Typically, if a mailbox is pushed over and has no impact marks, it was probably knocked over by the weight of snow coming off a plow's blade. If the mailbox or post shows evidence of an impact, it may have been struck by a Town or private contractor plow blade or a passing vehicle. The angle at which a mailbox has fallen also helps to determine the source of damage.

If a mailbox is damaged from snow coming off a plow blade, the Village will not replace the mailbox. In case of an emergency, we have a limited amount of temporary mailboxes you can use until your mailbox can be fixed. If your mailbox is down, please contact the public works department at 708-534-8306.

Taking time to prepare your mailbox for winter now can prevent serious headaches later. If your mailbox moves when shaken, it could be knocked over by snow thrown off the road by a passing snowplow. Residents should prepare mailboxes for winter by tightening screws and ensuring the post and receptacle are secure enough to endure large amounts of thrown snow. If a private contractor plows your driveway, we recommend that you learn their policies regarding damage to your (or your neighbor's) property caused by their operators or equipment.

Reminders to stay within compliance of Village Ordinances —

- Grass and weeds shall not exceed 6"
- When cutting grass, do not expel grass clippings on to streets; as this will clog storm drains.
- You are responsible for maintaining the grass and weeds up to the street on any side your lot adjoins including ditches.
- To cause or to permit to remain on any premises vegetation which includes, but not limited to, dead trees, shrubs or trees or shrubs that are infected with injurious insects, pests or infected with plant diseases which are liable to spread to other plants, trees or shrubs to the injury of said plants, trees or shrubs or to the injury of a person or property shall be considered a nuisance. (Ord. 1772, 12142016)
- Placement Of Containers For Collection; Time Period: It shall be the duty of any person having household garbage or rubbish to comply with all provisions of this chapter, and on each day of garbage, rubbish or recycling collection to place the containers as aforesaid on the curb in front of the residential premises receiving said disposal services no earlier than twelve o'clock (12:00) P.M. on the day before collection and should be removed by seven o'clock (7:00) P.M. the day of collection. All garbage, rubbish, or recycling containers shall not be stored in the front yards on nontrash days. All garbage, rubbish, or recycling containers shall be stored behind a privacy fence or out of view from public areas.
- All inoperable motor vehicles, INCLUDING any unregistered vehicle, whether on private or public property and in view of the general public are to be considered a nuisance. Inoperable vehicles means any motor vehicle for which a period of at least seven (7) days, the engine, wheels or other parts have been removed or on which the engine, wheels or other parts have been altered or so treated that the vehicle is incapable of being driven under its own motor power and the Illinois State Registration is expired!
- To park, store, keep any vehicle, trailer, RV likewise in any rear, side or front setbacks on private or public property on grass or gravel is prohibited.

Penalty: Any person found to be in violation may be subject to a fine. (Ord. 1773, 12142016)

Rental Property —

Application for license renewal must be filed at least thirty (30) days prior to the license expiration date.

Annual License Fees as follows:

- One or more rental housing units - \$75 (per unit)

Failure to comply with the rental ordinance in its entirety may result in citations/fines which could be issued on a daily basis. In addition, occupancy may be prohibited.

Permits —

Please check with the Building Services Department before starting your next project to verify if a permit is needed. Failure to obtain a permit when required may result in fines and penalties.

Additionally, all General & Sub-contractors are required to be licensed, registered and bonded with the Village of Monee.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

Monee Emergency Management Put To The Test With 2 Large Scale Training Exercises —

Monee EMA participated in two large training events which put the agency to the test. Director Randy Ulaskas reported the agency did outstanding and was very proud of Team EMA.

First Training:

A tabletop scenario in which Monee, Peotone, Beecher, and Crete were stuck with tornadoes with heavy damage and injuries.

The training was directed by Will County Emergency Management. The training lasted 8 hours and included Monee Fire, Public works, and Technology Director John Jones.

All agencies and Emergency operations centers were connected live and communicated in real time. All agencies used their combined Incident Command software package to manage the incident. This training was a year in planning by Will County Emergency Management.



Second Training:

A large search for a missing person at Monee Reservoir. This was a boots on the ground exercise. Monee EMA performed well and tested our operations planning and field equipment.
